





PERMANENT INCOME HYPOTHESIS

A noted U.S. Economist and Nobel laureate, <u>Milton Fried-</u> <u>man</u> is widely regarded as the 'Father of Monetarism'. In one of his earliest works- 'The Theory of the Consumption Function' (1957), he wrote about the permanent income effect.

The Permanent Income Hypothesis, also known as the Permanent Income Effect, puts forward that a consumer's consumption does not depend on their absolute or relative income, but rather on their 'permanent income'.

Let me try to simplify this hypothesis by giving an example. Suppose you have worked as a software developer at XYZ Ltd. for five years, during which you have gained valuable experience and perhaps even received a couple of promotions. Now, you have decided to leave your current job, which pays an average of ₹80,000 per month, to work for another company that offers better pay. Based on your experience and skill set, you are confident that you will be paid at least ₹1,00,000 per month, no matter where you go. This means that you have psychologically assured yourself of your long-term average income, more specifically your "permanent income."

This phenomenon results in a shift in your current consumption pattern, leading you to consume more in light of your expected long-term income. This hypothesis holds significant economic importance because when an individual's permanent income increases, their purchasing power grows, allowing for greater consumption and overall economic expansion through increased spending.

Under this theory, even if economic policies are successful in increasing income in the economy, they may not kick off a multiplier effect on increased consumer spending. Rather, the theory predicts that there will not be an uptick in consumer spending until workers reform expectations about their future incomes.




Cherished memories weaved into every day, In the English department, I found my way. Standing by each other, giving our very best, With different bonds shared, we've weathered every test.
